Kurt Patrick McKenzie

As Captain of the Organizational Development Bureau, Kurt McKenzie has twenty-two years of experience in Law Enforcement. Kurt began his career as a Patrol Officer and he has worked his way up to become a leader in community policing, civil unrest, police accountability and reform. He leads a vast bureau responsible for all training of new officers, annual training and in-service recertification.



Previously, Kurt served as Lieutenant over the Critical Incident Review Team (CIRT), responsible for the administrative investigation of all officerinvolved shootings and police incidents resulting in significant injury or death. Kurt oversaw a team of detectives that made recommendations to change policies, procedures, and tactics as a result of these investigations. Additionally, he served as the tactical commander for the Homeland Security Saturation Team (HSST) as well as the back-up SWAT tactical commander. There he oversaw the training and implementation for mobile field force, dignitary protection and site protection for critical infrastructure while in command over high-risk incidents.

Throughout his career Kurt McKenzie has continued to develop the necessary skills for leadership, training, and teambuilding. Kurt continues to encourage and recruit African Americans to explore careers in law enforcement and is committed to developing future leaders in the agency.

Kurt received his bachelor's degree in Biology from the University of New York College at Oswego. He is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, where he volunteers in internationally mandated programs which continue to contribute to community uplift and the empowerment of the black community. Kurt is also leading the charge on building bridges between the black communities and law enforcement in his work with the Las Vegas Black Police Association. His work with the Uplift Foundation providing scholarships, mentoring, outreach, and wellness has positively impacted the lives of youth and adults in Southern Nevada.

Kurt was born in Brooklyn, NY and has lived in Las Vegas since 2000. Kurt and his wife of twenty-one years, Connie, have two children: Xavier, a rising senior at Morehouse College (Atlanta) majoring in Communications and Zaria, a rising sophomore at Johnson C. Smith University (Charlotte) majoring in Biology. Together, with their rescue dog, Curly, they enjoy puzzles, outdoor adventures to National Parks and traveling as often as possible.

MEET OUR NEW LT. - KARL "JIMMY" LORSON

As Lieutenant of the Section Three Training Bureau, Jimmy Lorson has twenty-five years of experience in Law Enforcement. Jimmy began his career as an LVMPD Corrections Officer, and soon after, a Patrol Officer. Jimmy went to the Robbery/Homicide Section as a Robbery Detective in 2006. In 2015, he went to the Southeast Area Command as a Patrol Detective. In 2018, Jimmy promoted to the rank of sergeant, also in the Southeast Area Command. It was there that Jimmy was selected to be the Flex Enforcement sergeant with a focus on proactive policing. In 2021, Jimmy went to the South-Central Area Command as a Patrol Detective Sergeant. Soon after, Jimmy promoted to the rank of Lieutenant within the Spring Valley Area Command where he worked until taking over as the Lieutenant of Section Three Training. Within the Section Three Training Bureau, Jimmy oversees the Advanced Officer Skills Training (AOST), Reality Based Training (RBT), Multi-Assault Counter Terrorism Action Capabilities (MACTAC), and Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC). Each of these units are responsible for training over 2,000 students a year in their various disciplines.

Throughout his career Jimmy Lorson has continued to develop the necessary skills for leadership, training, and teambuilding. Jimmy strives to give back to his fellow officers by mentoring them to sought after positions in their careers. Jimmy takes these mentorships seriously, as the best reward for him is observing one of his mentored officers achieve the professional success they desire.




